PROJECT PILGRIM

It's been a busy summer.....

As we start the new term and welcome many of you back from the summer holidays, there has been significant progress on site.

Outside, the Cathedral Green has changed dramatically with the installation of limestone steps at the west end and a large proportion of the paving works in Upper College Green well underway. The 'spiral motif' which is intrinsic to the design of the space is now starting to emerge. As we move into the final months of landscaping, work will begin to install stone benches, lighting columns, 'street furniture' and the external interpretation scheme.

Inside, work at the west end of the Nave is moving forwards at speed... Now that the structural steels have been installed, the size and scale new glass entrance lobby is evident – we hope you agree that it will look magnificent once completed.

The new Gift Shop is very nearly finished! Once the final touches to the fixtures and fittings have been made the Team will be able to move merchandise into its new bespoke home.

The Lady Chapel is also starting to look rather special with its freshly cleaned walls and carefully restored Christopher Whall stained glass windows. Work will now begin to install new heating and lighting systems and we are confident that the chapel will reopen in time for Advent.

In the North Transept and Ambulatory, work to install two new lifts continues. Over the summer, we experienced several delays as we uncovered some unexpected archaeology. However, now that all design issues have been resolved, it won't be long before the lifts are installed.

As we move into the final stages of the capital works programme and the different building elements start to come together, there will be something new to see every time you visit. It truly will be worth the wait.
